Mum in job hunt

AFTER six years out of the workforce, Anne-Marie Roberts is one mum determined to find work.

The 37-year-old Cashmere resident had a career in insurance as an under writer and team leader, but decided to become a full-time housewife when she had her third child.

"I was at the company for 12 years and worked my way from a junior to a team leader," she said. Now with her children are aged six, eight and 11 years old, Mrs Roberts has started training to re-enter the workforce.

"I started the Worklinks program at Mitchelton, twice a week for five weeks," she said.

"There are three mums in the course. We work on our resumes and letters, they can even set you up with work experience for computer and admin skills."

Mrs Roberts hopes to nab a job in the administration field and said Worklinks had boosted her confidence.

"All I was looking at was Seek for work, but they told me so many other places to look," she said.

Worklinks run training sessions for all unemployed people to get back into the workforce.
